Adverbs of <u>manner</u>	(fast, quickly)
Adverbs of <u>place</u>	(here, there, out, down, away)
Adverbs of <u>time</u>	(later, then, today, already, yet)
Adverbs of <u>frequency</u>	(always, sometimes, never)
Adverbs of <u>purpose</u>	help to answer why something happened (so, since, thus)
Adverbs of <u>degree</u>	(very, fully, completely)
<u>Conjunctive Adverbs</u>	used to join ideas of equal value
<u>Focusing Adverbs</u>	used to draw attention to a particular part of a clause (only, just, especially, even, either, neither)
