Colossians 3, Message #12: Music Is an Integral Part of Worship Study Handout by Pastor Melissa Scott, Ph.D.

Below are some of the musical instruments mentioned in the Old Testament. This study handout accompanies Pastor Scott's message number VF-2307 on Colossians 3:16–17, preached on September 19, 2021 at Faith Center in Glendale, CA.

Horn:	Ram's horn, sometimes cornet. (Joshua 6:5)
Trumpet:	<i>Strong's 7782.</i> Shofar, a curved horn used by the Levites. (Zechariah 9:14, Joshua 6:5)
Silver Trumpet:	Strong's 2689. A cubit long. Used for specific calls or signals. (Numbers 10:1–2, 9–10)
Pipe:	Strong's 2485. Perforated. (1 Samuel 10:5, 1 Kings 1:40)
Flute:	(Daniel 3:5)
Cornet:	(Daniel 3:5)
Organ:	Like a pipe that used a reed. (Job 21:12)
Dulcimer:	(Daniel 3:5, 10)
Tabret/Timbrel:	Tambourine. (Genesis 31:27)
Tinklers:	Strong's 4700. (KJV: "cymbals"). (1 Chronicles 13:8)
Sistrum:	Strong's 4517. (KJV: "cornets"). (2 Samuel 6:5)
Cymbals:	Strong's 6767. (Psalm 150:5)
Drum:	Strong's 8608. (KJV: "playing with timbrels"). (Psalm 68:25)
Bells:	Worn on the bottom of high priest's clothing. (Exodus 28:33-35)
Harp:	3 or more strings. (Isaiah 16:11)
Lute:	Possibly 6 strings across a wooden form. (KJV: "psaltery" or "viols"). (1 Samuel 10:5, Amos 5:23)
Lyre:	Made of sheep intestines which were stretched over a gap to form tension. (KJV: "harp"). (1 Samuel 16:23)
Psaltery:	12-stringed instrument. (Daniel 3:5)
Zither:	Strong's 6218. 10-stringed instrument similar to the lyre.
Sackbut:	Strong's 5443. 4-stringed instrument. (Daniel 3:5)
Lute:	Long neck, hollow body. (KJV: "mahalath," in header of Psalm 88)
