"To Fill" and related words

Word Group: *pimpleemi*

Rather strangely, the two main senses "to fill" and "to satisfy" are in the New Testament cleanly divided between the simple and compound forms. The content is always in the genitive.

1. pimpleemi is used spatially in Lk 5:7, Mt 22:10, 27:48

It is also used of intellectual and spiritual processes. Reactions to the words and works of Jesus....

Within the writing of Luke, the Spirit of prophecy causes Elisabeth (1:41) and Zacharias (1:67) to magnify the fulfillment of God's promise of salvation in the sons of Mary and Elisabeth. The same Spirit is promised to the Baptist from his mother's womb, 1:15. In Acts, $\pi\lambda\eta\sigma\theta\tilde{\eta}\nu\alpha\iota$ describes the work of the Holy Spirit in Christians. The primary reference here is not to the receiving of the Spirit of prophecy but to the fact that filling with the Spirit conveys the power of preaching, e.g., to Peter before his address in Acts 4:8, to all believers prior to their witness at the prayer meeting in 4:31... to Paul before his sermon in 13:9.

In 2:4 the receiving of the Spirit brings the gift of tongues.

Of the other Word Group: *pleeroma*,

which is used in Ephesians 1:23, denotes the *soma*, the body, with this use directly linked to Christ as He alone is the bearer of the divine fulness in whom God hath reconciled His enemies.
