Word Study on "Works"

New Testament use of "works" (source: Strong's Exhaustive Concordance heading "works" from Matthew to Colossians)

In Matthew's Gospel:

- Matthew 5:16 "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." καλὰ ἕργα (noun, accusative) read verses 13 - 16context: the *outraying* of Christ in you
- Matthew 7:22 "Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?" δυνάμεις (noun, accusative) πολλάς \rightarrow not erga
- Matthew 11:2 "Now when John had heard in the prison the works of Christ, he sent two of his disciples..." ἔργα (noun, accusative) τοῦ Χριστοῦ ("works of Christ" genitive case)
- Matthew 11:20 "Then began he to upbraid the cities wherein most of his mighty works were done, because they repented not..." πλεῖσται δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)
- Matthew 11:21 "Woe unto thee, Chorazin! woe unto thee, Bethsaida! for if the mighty works, which were done in vou..."

δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)

- Matthew 11:23 "And thou, Capernaum, which art exalted unto heaven, shalt be brought down to hell: for if the mighty works, which have been done in thee..." δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)
- Matthew 13:54 "And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, insomuch that they were astonished, and said, Whence hath this man this wisdom, and these mighty works?" δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)
- Matthew 13:58 "And he did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief." δυνάμεις (noun, accusative)
- Matthew 14:2 "And therefore mighty works do shew forth themselves in him." δυνάμεις (noun, nominative) ένεργοῦσιν
- Matthew 16:27 "And then he shall reward every man according to his works." κατὰ τὴν *πρᾶξιν (noun, accusative) αὐτοῦ *(The title of the book of Acts in Greek reads "The $\pi\rho\tilde{\alpha}\xi$ of the Apostles")
- Matthew 23:3 "But do not ye after their works..." ἔργα (noun, accusative) αὐτῶν μὴ
- Matthew 23:5 "But all of their works they do for to be seen of men..."

12 occurrences in Matthew, however 7 times *dunameis*, 4 times *erga* and 1 time *praxin*.

In Mark's Gospel:

- Mark 6:2 "And when the sabbath day was come, he began to teach in the synagogue: and many hearing him were astonished...that even such <u>mighty works</u> are wrought by his hands?" δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)
- Mark 6:14 "That John the Baptist was risen from the dead, and therefore <u>mighty works</u> do shew forth themselves in him." δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)

ουναμεις (noun, nominative)

2 occurrences in Mark – both times dunameis

In Luke's Gospel:

- Luke 10:13 "For if the <u>mighty works</u> had been done…" δυνάμεις (noun, nominative)
- Luke 19:37 "The whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all <u>the mighty</u> <u>works</u> that they had seen." δυνάμεων (noun, genitive)

2 occurrences in Luke - both times duna derivatives

In John's Gospel:

- John 5:20 "And he will shew him greater works than these..." ἕργα (noun, accusative)
- John 5:36 "For the <u>works</u> which the Father hath given me to finish, the same <u>works</u> that I do..." ἕργα (noun, nominative)
- **John 6:28** "Then said they unto him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?" εργαζώμεθα τὰ ἕργα (noun, accusative) (genitive →) τοῦ θεοῦ
- **John 7:3** "Go into Judaea, that thy disciples also may see <u>the works</u> that thou doest." ἕργα (noun, accusative)
- John 7:7 "That <u>the works</u> thereof are evil." ἕργα (noun, nominative)
- John 8:39 "<u>The works</u> of Abraham." ἕργα (noun, accusative)
- John 9:3 "Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that <u>the works of God</u> should be made manifest in him." τὰ ἔργα (noun, nominative) τοῦ θεοῦ
- John 9:4 "I must <u>work the works</u> of <u>him</u> that sent me, while it is day." (verb →) ἕργαζεσθαι τὰ ἕργα (← noun, accusative)
- John 10:25 "<u>The works</u> that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me." ἕργα (noun, nominative)

John 10:32 "Jesus answered them, Many good works haved I shewed you from my Father; for which one of those works do ye stone me?"

1) ἕργα καλὰ (noun, accusative) 2) ἕργα (noun, accusative)

- **John 10:37** "If I do not <u>the works of my Father</u>, believe me not." ἕργα τοῦ (noun, accusative) πατρός μου
- John 10:38 "Believe <u>the works</u>…" ἕργοις (noun, dative)
- **John 14:10** "I speak not of myself: but the Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth <u>the works</u>." ἕργα (noun, accusative)
- John 14:12 "He that believeth on me, <u>the works</u> that I do shall he do also…" (KJV reads <u>twice</u>; in the Greek text once) ἕργα (noun, accusative)
- John 15:24 "If I had not done among them <u>the works</u> which none other man did…" ἕργα (noun, accusative)
- 17 occurrences in John are all erga and its derivatives

In Matthew, Mark, Luke and John the English word "works" is used, however in the Greek:

<u>11 times *dunameis*</u> – cognate: dynamite <u>21 times *erga* – cognate: energy</u> <u>1 *praxin* – cognate: practice</u>

- o <u>Most</u> of these are nouns in the <u>accusative</u> or <u>nominative</u>.
- o Greek nouns function the same as English Person, Place, Thing (and sometimes/ideas).
- In English we determine the subject by its placement, generally before the verb.
- In Greek we can determine what function the noun plays by inflection or "declension."

Cases:

- Accusative: If a word is the direct object of the verb it will be in the accusative.
- o Nominative: This case usually indicates the subject of the sentence.
- o Dative: This case usually indicates the indirect object.
- o Genitive: Case of possession, source.
